The annual donation to the BC Golf Museum has been made. A reminder to our members of the value of having a provincial museum and the wealth of resources available to us.

Gail presented the Financial Report on screen that had been circulated to attendees. A change for the 2022 Season is the levy that will be charged member clubs; it will be \$2 per golf member, not the usual \$4. This levy charge will be reviewed again for the 2023 Season. Zone 4 has given our annual donation to BC Golf House. This place is such an important asset for clubs that want to know more about their history, particularly if you are celebrating a milestone anniversary such as 75 or even 100.

I used this resource this summer as I was curious to find out more about the trophy that is awarded to the BC Golf Women's Amateur Champion. The trophy is 116 years old and called the Flumerfelt trophy. It turns out it was a female golfer from 1905 who donated the trophy. Up until that time the female golfers only received a keeper trophy such as a perfume bottle, or a silver box.

I also want to acknowledge two long time zone 4 volunteers and players who passed away this year. Sybil Rodger was our Zone 3/4 Coordinator who passed away in July and Helen Steeves was a long time board member who passed away in October. You will have already received email notices with more information about their many contributions.

For Sybil we have made a donation to the BC Golf's Women's Golf Fund. Members can apply to this fund for financial assistance in four areas: amateur competitions, referee certification, course rating workshops and coach certification.

A donation in Helen's name has yet to be finalized.

As we look forward to the 2022 golf season, we are very thankful for all the golf opportunities we have had during the pandemic. However, now our thoughts for the Zone 4 Executive are turning to team play, tournaments and possibly a rules/handicap session in the spring.

We will be looking for volunteers to help with these events so please help us out if you can manage the time. We would very much appreciate it.

It's time to take a look ahead to our 2022 season. Your executive members will be introduced and this is a good opportunity to put a face with a name of the executive person you may want to call with one of your club's golf questions.

Rules Chair, Bernice Pozdrowski

There is not much to write in my report because our Zone 4 schedule was cancelled this year. I have been refereeing for CJGA, BC Golf and VGT which has kept me busy through the golfing season. I was also fortunate to assist in teaching future Provincial Referees. We have some Zone 4 women that now have their Provincial credentials which will hopefully lead to a future Zone 4 Rules Chair.

As Rules Chair, I still made myself available to answering emails from clubs with questions on the rules of golf. Many clubs have expressed an interest to have rules seminars at their clubs next year. If a rules seminar does go forward, I strongly suggest that we do an outdoor demonstration of the most common errors that occur on the course.

Team 2 Chair, Ying He

The 2021 Team play was cancelled, at this moment we anticipate the 2022 season will go ahead with a full schedule.

I've received confirmation from nine clubs that they will form a 2nd team in 2022, including: Burnaby Mountain, Fraserview, Greenacres, Kings Links, Langara, McCleery, Squamish Valley, University and Vancouver Chinese Ladies.

I'm waiting for Kings Links to provide their Team 2 Captain contact info before sending out a full list to all team2 captains for their purpose of scheduling and score posting exchanges.

Team Play schedules will be communicated and distributed once it's ready.

Team 3 Chair, Leslie Dobie

I do not have much to report. I canvassed the existing Team 3s and currently have 10 teams. Squamish and Kings Links are no longer fielding a Team 3 and I believe that Sunshine Coast has withdrawn from Team play entirely. The 10 teams are Burnaby Mountain, Bowen Island, Delta, Langara, Mylora, Musqueam, Country Meadows, University, McCleery and Fraserview.

Due to the decrease in the Team 3s the five-year schedule needed to be redone. I did this on Saturday October 23rd and submitted it to Sherry Work for her to adjust accordingly with the Team 2 schedule.

I am looking forward to next year and being the Team 3 Chair, hoping that we can safely play Team again.
