8.1 Treasurer's Report

Zone 4 Fall Captains' Meeting 2022

Treasurer's Report – Gail Lichty

My apologies for the delay in sending out our 2022 Budget and Financial Statement. Hopefully you have had a chance to review the details.

This year our Zone 4 levy was reduced to \$2.00 per member, as we still had some funds carried over from the 2020 levy. We had anticipated that this would result in a budget deficit approximately equal to the reduced levy. There was less of a deficit due to a few items that have did not meet the budgeted amounts; in particular the costs for our meetings and the cancellation of our Senior Open Tournament.

The Zone 4 Women's account is slightly down, with a current balance of \$42,194.87. However, we owe \$2586.70 to the Junior Girls account; this will be done once we have the balance of the BC Golf Grant. As a result, our position at the end of our season is expected to be \$39,608.07.

At this point I would like to have a motion to accept the 2022 Zone 4 Women's Committee Budget and Financial Statement dated October 23, 2022.

As we prepare our budget for 2023, the income will be based on our standard Levy of \$4.00 per member. It would not be in the best interest of the clubs to take substantial losses each season. The 2023 Levy invoices will be based on the final roster provided by BC Golf at the end of October and sent out to Captains in the new year

ZONE 4 AGM MEETING

October 27, 2022

RULES CHAIR REPORT

2022 was a busy year for me. I was fortunate to being involved in the instruction of Provincial Level referees in February and March. They were done by weekly ZOOM meetings. We now have 4 qualified female provincial referees for zone 4 and next year, I know that we will have 4 nationally credited female referees. I recommend this course for anyone who is interested in rules. There is no requirement to write the exam.

Zone 4 offered an outdoor, hands on, Rules & Handicap Clinic in April and I was very pleased with the attendance. It was generously hosted by Delta Golf Course. I was assisted by Hitomi Ishikura, (Langara Golf Course), Sherry Work, (Burnaby Golf Course), Teresa Pickering, (Tsawwassen) and Delphia Johnstone (Seymour). I want to take this opportunity to thank them for their great job. It wouldn't have been a success without their contribution.

2022 was a year of attempting to get back to pre- COVID; with normal, daily routines. In this spirit, Zone 3 and 4 reactivated their traditional women's tournaments. More will be said by the executive. It is always fun for me to be part of these tournaments and its set up.

A new rules book will come into effect on January 1st, 2023. It will not have the dramatic changes that occurred in 2019. For the most part, it will incorporate the clarifications of the 2019 rules of golf that were updated every quarterly from the R&A, USGA and Golf Canada in the last four years. The clarifications were a way of tweaking the rules of golf to make them more understandable and fairer to the player without the cost of constantly updating the rule book. The restrictions of stickers on club faces and what materials are allowed for the purpose of reading greens are examples of some of the clarifications that I think will be added to the updated rule book.

This is my final year as your Zone 4 Rules Chair. I have been your chair for the past seven years; I have enjoyed every minute of it but it is time to pass on the baton. To be a rules chair, it is necessary that the individual should have passed the provincial rules exam, called level 2, as well as have the required tournament hours to make them certified. The tournament hours give the level 2 referee, the experience and exposure needed to gain confidence in making rulings. A rules chair will also be responsible for overseeing zone tournaments and answer rules queries from its membership.

Moira Milligan has kindly agreed to take up this challenge. She has her provincial rules credentials and I know that she will get her national credentials next year although she doesn't need to. I have worked with Moira the last two years on various tournaments and she has demonstrated her knowledge of the rules and her ability to make rulings for and against players. This is not always a comfortable thing to do. She also attended the Golf Canada TARS seminar this spring at Nanaimo. TARS stands for Tournament Administration and Rules Seminar. It is Golf Canada's hope that these types of seminars will build National Rules Chairs for future tournaments. We had a lot of fun and I think that both of us learned a lot.

Moira is a member of the Zone 4 Tsawwassen Springs Business Ladies League. She was the rules chair for their Zone3/4 Business Ladies Tournament held on her home course with all the work that it entails. She did a course survey, the course markings, the notice to the players, refereed the event and handled issues with players in the scoring tent. I was there to assist and I found that she managed it so well that there was little for me to do or comment on.

You can easily understand why I am confident and happy to pass the baton on to Moira Milligan, your next Zone 4 Rules Chair. One other big plus for Moira is that she has great computer skills.

8.3. Handicap Report

Handicap Chair report – October 27, 2022

A question has arisen from one of our clubs whether it is still necessary to post scores with "Tournament" designation. A short answer is NO – as of 2020 the Exceptional Score Reduction is done automatically.

A handout has been placed at your table with the explanation provided by Golf Canada with the formula for an Exceptional Score Reduction. Below 7.0 strokes there is no ESR. Between 7.0 to 9.0 strokes an ESR of -1.0 is applied to the most recent 20 score differentials. 10.0 or more strokes will see an ESR of -2.0 applied to the most recent 20 score differentials.

Scores submitted following the exceptional score will not be subject to the ESR unless that score is also exceptional. Eventually, the reduction will work itself out of the player's record.

Now for the YES answer – a player who wish to keep stats of the "Tournament Scores" may continue to enter the appropriate score(s) with the "Tournament" designation.

Women's Committee Meeting – October 27, 2022

I begin my report by acknowledging the life and work of Ann Warrender, Past Chair who passed away on August 15, 2022 after a 3-year battle with cancer. Ann's work for Zone 4 golf was continuous, on August 12th, she walked me through all of the wind-up procedures for the season. She applauded the hard work of each of you in making Zone 4 a professional, smooth functioning entity for women golfers in our zone and in BC. In keeping with past traditions, a donation of \$100 in memory of Ann will be given to The Golf House Society. Ann was a member of their Board of Directors since 2010.

The 2023 season began with our first in-person, since 2019, Spring Meeting. This was followed by a successful joint Handicap/Rules Seminar held at Delta GC. and then the Zone 3 and 4 Amateur/Senior Championships. Thanks to Virginia Astell in securing Marine Drive GC and McCleery GC, we produced timely registration information and the response was positive including a waitlist by closing date. We enjoyed Team play again with lots of reuniting with friends although some inclement weather was around. Team 2 and Team 3 competition also featured a trial season of individual green fee payment for visiting teams. A great start to the season!

The sharing of results and information on the website was facilitated by Sherry and Liz distributed my bi-monthly Captain's/Vice Captain's newsletter providing updates on Zone 4 teams and Championships. The reciprocal sharing of information with Zone 3 Executive assisted in understanding the challenges of returning to a full event schedule and Team play after COVID.

The Zone 3 and 4 Four Ball at Sandpiper was very successful in spite of the extreme heat but participants missed having a shotgun start and concluding awards luncheon. The Zone 3 Senior Women's and Zone 4 Senior Women's events were both cancelled due to lack of registration numbers required by courses to run a shotgun format. Zone 3 pushed for 120 and had 73 at closing and Zone 4 needed 80 reaching only 42 at closing. In talking with the Zone 3 executive members involved, we considered that amalgamating the two Fall Senior Women's events may

provide a richer registration base and meet course requirements for shotgun starts. Prizes and awards would continue to be awarded for each Zone. Consideration would be for courses that were attractive to players in both zones in terms of transportation, accommodations (if necessary) and an afternoon shotgun time.
