## Schedule A: Zone 4 Executive Reports

### 7.1 Treasurer's Report: Gail Lichty, Zone 4

Our 2023 Budget and Financial Statement were emailed out this week; hopefully you have had a chance to review the details.

We had projected a loss for 2023, but now it looks like we will actually be ahead when all is settled.

Income: ☒

- This year our Zone 4 levy was reinstated at \$4.00 per member, but this was missed in planning the budget for 2023. You can see that the income is almost double what was budgeted. This basically accounts for the positive balance in the current budget.
- The funds noted under the BC Golf Grant are the balance of 2022, received in December, and the advance for 2023. We have not yet received the final 2023 grant and may not see these funds until November or December. We don't have the actual split between women and juniors for the 2023 funds.
- There was greater participation in the Dorothy Olive Franklin Memorial Tournament and Pin Rounds this year. Thank you to all clubs playing in these events as the funds go to BC Golf to support Junior Girls and Women's player development programs. The Beat the Champ competition had great participation as well and these funds support the Junior programs within Zone 4.
- A nice little surprise is our interest income due to the increase in interest rates.

Expenses:

- Our tournaments were only slightly over budget, but we are happy with the balances. Once consideration that is being discussed is to increase the prizes for these events.
- As there are now 3 tournaments shared with Zone 3, the profit/loss for one can then be applied to the others.
- Unfortunately we did not have a full contingent of players participating in the BC Amateur Championships, so we did not fully utilize the subsidies.
- Our costs for executive meetings and transportation are lower due to using a lot of email communications and zoom.
- There are still some expenses to come in; such as costs for today's Captains' Meeting and some operating expenses.

Next is our Financial Statement. This basically takes the details from our income and expenses to determine our financial position. Our bank balances are secure and we can continue to operate in the event of issues with income sources.

Are there any questions about either of these reports?

We now need a motion to adopt the Zone 4 Women's Committee 2023 Budget dated October 15, 2023.

Also, we need a motion to accept the Financial Statement for October 15, 2023.

Just a quick reminder that the yearly zone levy is based on the previous year's membership. BC Golf will be sending us the membership count for 2023 and this is how we will determine the levy for 2024. Please consider this when you plan your budgets for 2024. If you are unsure of the numbers, you can contact Corrie at BC Golf.

Now I would like to take a moment to thank the zone 4 clubs and executive for all the support they have given to me over the past 4 years. This is the end of my second 4 year stint as Treasurer and I have had the opportunity to meet and talk to many club executive members. Every member who volunteers to represent their club is providing valuable service to both their players and the zone.

Although I will be stepping down at the end of the season, I will continue to assist Brenda and the executive until we find a replacement. We could use your help in this endeavour. It may sound daunting, but the role of the Treasurer is really just arithmetic! An accounting or bookkeeping background is not needed. Simply the ability to balance a bank book and some skill in Microsoft Excel.

Please ask around your club to see if there is anyone who is willing to give this a try. I can spend as much time as necessary to assist in the take over and be available to help with any issues that arise.

**7.4 Handicap Chair: Lily Ravelo, Zone 4**

Just a quick recap of the Rules of Handicapping:

1. In 2023 Rule 3.3b (4) now says a player is no longer required to show their handicap on their scorecard or to add up their own scores. It is the committee's responsibility to calculate the player's handicap strokes for the competition and to use that handicap to calculate the player's net score.

I would like to remind all clubs to continue to encourage their members to post their scores:

1. On a hole-by-hole basis;
2. To post their scores as soon as possible after their round, by 9 pm on the day of play; Point #2 was brought up at the joint Rules/Handicap Seminar held in the spring at Langara Golf Course.

Why 9pm, when it states by midnight? Yes, it does state in the manual that midnight is the deadline to shoot for, however, Golf Canada is located in Ontario and Ontario being 3 hours ahead of BC, we want to ensure that our members' posted scores are included when handicap calculation or adjustments take place.

### 7.7 Co-ordinator Report: Holly Horwood, Zone 3-4

With three jointly-managed Zone 3 and 4 tournaments successfully completed in 2023, plans are in the works for 2024.

The planning to date:

- **Zones 3 and 4 Amateur/Senior Championships. Proposed dates: Monday June 3 and Tuesday June 4.** This event includes a first day at a public golf course; the second day at a private club in the Nine-Year Rotation cycle. 60 players. Prizes in both Zones and respective Divisions, as well as Zone Team members selected to the Provincial Amateur and Senior Championships. Currently both **Hazelmere (possibly \$90 green fee) and Fraserview** have indicated an interest in hosting the first day. **Shaughnessy** will host the final day and awards luncheon. Expecting final approval by AGM, October 9.
- **Zones 3 and 4 Partner Best-Ball: Confirmed for Monday June 24, at Green Acres. Shotgun at 1 p.m.**
- **Zones 3 and 4 Senior Fall Classic: No dates, or courses proposed.**

**Discussion Points:**

1. **Costs of Entry Fees:** Amateur/Senior - Are we happy with \$155 for either Amateur or Senior or \$165 Amateur and Senior (B.C. Players Club - \$4 more). Do we require a bump-up?
2. Are we happy running the Amateur and Senior Championships from the **same tees?** (If we choose Fraserview this year, would likely use Tee 3 – 5862 yards, 121/73.2) or Hazelmere (5279 yards, 120/71.5). Shaughnessy Red tees: 5400 yards, 71.8/126.  
Discussion: Perhaps Hazelmere over Fraserview since Zone 3 golfers will have to travel into the city for both rounds. Fraserview may offer Sr. discount (65+), but not all players qualify; it is onerous to have to provide proof. We may have to look at week of May 27
3. Should we try to **move the Senior Fall Classic to another course** – perhaps Hazelmere if we go with Fraserview for the Amateur/Senior? Are we happy with trying to book **Monday, September 16, 2024?**
4. Do we wish to make the Fall Classic an event for **women of all ages** – or keep it to Seniors over 50 years? Still keep prizes age-related.
5. Courses, dates for Senior Fall Classic?
6. Can we **improve our registration process** for all Tournaments? If so, how?

**7.8 Vice-Chair Report Jessie Horner, Zone 4**

Jessie spoke about her ongoing duties on updating the Captain's Manual. Two changes were highlighted 1) Team Captains are allowed to play even though they fall out of range for that TEAM match; however, they must play in handicap order and 2) Dispute resolution committee will be formed and the composition is TBD so this is no longer the TEAM one chair's responsibility.
