9) New Business

- a) Team Play at Bowen Island by Joanne Grassman & Annabelle Pyko
 - i) A presentation from the Bowen Island GC, in response to the reluctance of Team clubs to travel to Bowen, highlighted the many benefits of their course.
 - ii) This includes a lovely 9-hole course, a very good restaurant, and on team days, reduced visitor \$70.00 green fees and \$40.00 for a cart.
 - iii) An experience card will reduce the rate of the ferry fee for cars to \$29.00 return.
 - iv) There are 3 ferries in the morning, suggestion to take the 8:05am ferry and to arrive at the terminal no later than 7:15am
- b) Golf Genius Overview was presented by Susan Haines and Tracy Tomlinson from Tsawwassen. Key Takeaways:
 - i) Golf Genius is being utilized by a growing number of golf courses for tournaments, such as Tsawwassen Springs and University.
 - ii) These courses are encouraging clubs to utilize the platform which then costs \$5.00 a season per member; with the course paying for the platform themselves.
 - iii) It allows the course to automatically access the draw information from the clubs into their scheduling
 - iv) It also automatically tracks member handicaps from Golf Canada.
 - v) There are many other functions and members can sign up for Golf Genius if they have a Golf Canada membership and take a look around the site.
 - vi) Biggest hurdle to many clubs, is it is quite costly for a club to take on without the Golf Course utilizing the platform. The Zone does utilize the platform and there was interest to see if there was a way for Zone clubs to utilize under the Zone umbrella.
- c) BC Golf Cloud Series presented by Jessie Horner
 - i) There are 6 formats under the Cloud series, one for each month in the season. April Shamble, May Best Ball, June Scramble, July Stableford, August Chapman, September Best Ball. Prizes for Gross, Net and Participation.
 - ii) Sign up on the BC Golf website, can play any day that month at any course that is rated, and enter result after the round into golf genius. Link is on the BC Golf website.

8 a) Treasurer's Report – Lily Zhao

Hi everyone,

Nice to see you again!

Copies of our Financial Statement for 2025, Budget for Women 2026 and Budget for Junior Girls 2026 were sent out via email. Hopefully you have had a chance to review the details.

We had a healthy fiscal year in 2025. Through the financial position of 2025, you can see that the income and expenses were well balanced.

As for the budget for women, we expected slightly lower levy income in 2026. On top of slightly lower registration of women and junior girls' golfers, we just learned that Pender Harbor decided to leave Zone 4 Women. I am currently issuing the levy invoices. You either have received the invoice, or you will get it in days. Please keep in mind that the due date is May 1, 2026.

We also expected lower expenses since we only hold Zone 3/4 Fall Classic tournament.

The budget for junior girls of Zone 3 and Zone 4 was adjusted based on last year's actual income and expenses. We spent a lot of money on junior girls last year. For one thing, we hope that we can attract more junior girls to participate the sport of golf. For another thing, we have accumulated good amount of funds for junior girls over the years. We wanted to invest the funds to our future champions. We had 6 successful events for junior girls in 2025. This year, we will focus on balance the income and the expenses. As you can see in the budget, we largely reduce the loss.

I hope we women golfers will actively participate all the tournaments organized by zone 3 and zone 4, and by individual golf clubs.

I look forward to another prosperous fiscal year.

I reviewed the Zone 4 website Rules section, ensured links were up to date, added information on the multi-language options for the R&A Rules of Golf and provided a simple foldable reference to 6 common rules of golf. I cannot overemphasize the value of the R&A website, both on and off the course and encourage all to complete the free Level One.

Education is a key responsibility, and we had a good turnout for the Zone 4 Seminar held March 26th at Greenacres. Thanks to Brenda for all her work putting that in place. I'm involved in two more clinics, one at my home course, our second "annual"

Tsawwassen Springs Shotgun, Brunch and Rules Clinic on April 14th which is open to all Zone 4 league members - over 20 non-local ladies have already registered. And on April 21st, I am doing a Rules Clinic for the University Golf Club Tuesday Ladies.

If you have rules questions or your club is having any particular rules challenges, I will do my best to assist you to resolve.

I will be at our Zone 3 - 4 tournaments and look forward to meeting many more Zone players.

8 d) Handicap Chair report submitted by Lily Ravelo

The Handicap Committee play an important role in upholding the integrity of the Rules of Handicapping and the accuracy of golfers' Handicap Indexes.

[The R&A - Handicapping Rules](#)

Handicapping allows a golfer to compete equitably with differing skill levels.

Yours club's Handicap Committee is required to properly know the procedures that will provide a platform for equitable and enjoyable games.

The Role and Responsibilities of the Handicap Committee:

- Administers the club members' Handicap Index
- Provide education to club members as to their responsibilities under the World Handicap System and the Rules of Handicapping
- Conduct Handicap Reviews

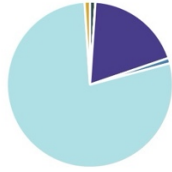
It is the role of the Handicap Committee to ensure that members are complying pursuant to the Rules of Handicapping by:

- the ability to access the Golf Canada Score Centre on smart phones and tablets by using the Golf Canada app
- the requirement to post every acceptable score to maintain a Handicap Index
- encourage posting of scores before midnight on the day of play
- posting scores on a hole-by-hole basis to utilize the automatic score adjustments

The Handicap Committee in ensuring that members are following their responsibilities, per the Rules of Handicapping, can review that members are posting their scores in a timely manner (day of play) and whether they are posting scores.

These are the specific instructions to make it easy to ensure your members have posted their scores.

1. Sign into Golf Canada as administrator for your club.
2. Go to "REPORTS".
3. Go to "SCORES POSTED BY DATE"
4. Enter the "START DATE" and "END DATE". You may have to play with these a bit, or also eliminate the "DAYS OF THE WEEK" you aren't interested in. If you're only interested in Tuesdays, remove the other 6 days. Or you could use Tuesday and Wednesday to catch scores posted the next day.
5. Click "VIEW REPORT".
6. You will see who posted a score on that day. You may need to click on the PRINT icon, to improve the display.
7. Compare with your draw to see if everyone has posted.
8. Any member who has not yet posted their score should receive a reminder email requesting them to do so

8 g) First Team Chair Report– Jesse Horner

1. Zone 4 has now separated from Zone 3 at the First Team level. We have four teams in our Zone Team 1: Fraserview, Langara, University and the Vancouver Chinese Ladies. This means that we will play one team twice over the season.
2. I have great hopes of arranging a play-off for the MacAdam Cup—this is a gorgeous cup that was donated to the Vancouver districts before we were divided into Zones. I've been communicating with the Team Coordinator for the Zone 4 private courses and the Team Captains from Zone 3, hoping to arrange a playoff for the MacAdam Cup. Some of the issues are whether play would be heads up or handicapped, who would pay green fees and where we would play.
3. I followed up on a request that I made last year to Riverway, with the Vancouver Chinese Ladies to see about a more reasonable green fee at Riverway. The manager of golf operations has met us part way, in that when VCL is hosting at Riverway, the visitors can now pay their own green fees at the pro shop, which means that players can take advantage of seniors' rates, should they be seniors, and that visitors can use their loyalty membership card for credit.
4. The Team Manual that was approved at the AGM last fall did not include a provision that had been previously agreed to. This is the proviso that team captains may play with their teams, even if they might not otherwise qualify. This was an oversight on my part and it has been corrected.

8 g) Second Team Chair Report – Sherry Work

I have sent out the final schedule for Team 2 to the current Team Captains based on the information we have at this time.

I had a Zoom meeting with a team captain who wanted to know how the team schedule was created.

A major concern was that some clubs had to play the same clubs two years in a row. I reviewed schedules going back to 2018 to see how teams from the same clubs were grouped each year. One team cancelled, or another team was moved into the group, and now the balance of two home matches and two away matches is no longer even.

8 g) Third Team Chair Report: Debbie McKay, Zone 4

Early this year, Delta Golf Club withdrew from Team 3 due to uncertainty with their golf course being in receivership. Our Team 3 club roster is now at nine. As a result the Team 3 schedule required last minute redrafting as it is prepared well in advance.

8 h) Zone 3 & 4 Coordinator Report -Holly Horwood

Madame Chair, Captains and Vice-Captains:

The main task of the Women's Zones 3 and 4 Coordinator is to scout golf courses willing to host our three different, jointly-run events each year.

This, frankly, is not an easy task.

Golf courses have been increasingly reluctant to host Shotgun events – at least without demanding exorbitant fees and/or including expensive add-ons like “tailgate grill parties” which sound great until you see the bill.

Traditionally we have run our Shotgun events at cost, with an eye to full participation and fun.

So we are grateful to Green Tee Country Club which welcomed our hosting request this year with enthusiasm. The beautiful Green Tee golf course in Langley will be the site of our Zone 3 and 4 Partner Best Ball shotgun event on Monday, July 6. It will be a road trip well worth it.

Similarly, thank-you in advance to management at Mayfair Lakes which will welcome Zone 3 and Zone 4 lady golfers for our annual Fall Classic afternoon shotgun on Monday, September 21. Mark your calendar for this very popular event.

Ladies, our annual two-day Zone 3 and Zone 4 Amateur and Senior Championships is scheduled for Burnaby Mountain on the first day, Monday May 25; with the second and final day at Seymour Golf Club on Tuesday May 26. This is a competitive event, with only 60 players in the two divisions in the field. As well, the event determines the two-member teams from each Zone to the provincial Amateur and Senior championships. I wish to thank our Zone chairs Pam Kelly for Zone 4 and Val Barker in Zone 3, along with past chair Brenda Burroughs, for all their support. Their energy and commitment ensure these events are staged successfully year after year.

8 i) Webmaster – Sherry Work

I am still serving as webmaster for Zone 4 Men, as well as for our club website. I want to remind everyone about the “Club Event” tab. If you are looking for new members or if you have a special tournament you would like to advertise, I can post it for you.

8 j) Past Chair - Jessie Horner

1. Nominating Committee: The clubs that comprise the Nominating Committee this year are Greenacres, Monday and Tuesday, Kings Links and Langara.
2. We have been communicating over the urgent need to find a nomination for Vice Chair. This is no longer a commitment for six years, now for three years: one year as Vice-Chair, one year as Chair and one year as Past Chair. If a person were to come on as Vice Chair in the next month or so, they could certainly discuss with Pam how to ensure a reasonable period of mentorship. It is a wonderful opportunity to contribute to women's golf.
3. We were sorry to lose Moira Milligan who has served as Rules Chair for many years, but we are delighted that Teresa Pickering who is a nationally certified referee has accepted the appointment, to be ratified at this meeting. Teresa has significant experience working in the public sector in Alberta. She has been a member at Mayfair Lakes and is now at Tsawwassen. She has a superb knowledge and understanding of the Rules of Golf and her approach exemplifies the Spirit of the Game. She is there to assist players apply the Rules to themselves.
4. Similarly, Ezebellah Hernandez, who served as our Junior Chair for several years, advised late last fall that she would not continue in the position. As our Junior program is run jointly with Zone 3, I approached the Zone 3 Junior Chair, Christine Wong, to see if she had any suggestions. And she did! She suggested someone who has been very active helping with the Junior Program and who also happens to be her husband, Josh Kujundzic. He writes: Josh Kujundzic is a PGA of Canada Class "A" Professional and Vancouver-born golfer who serves as a Golf Professional at Quilchena Golf and Country Club and co-owner of CJS Golf Academy. With experience competing at the collegiate and professional levels, along with several years of professional caddying to help guide players to success, Josh brings a well-rounded performance background to his coaching. Known for his positive approach and clear communication style, he specializes in player development and creates an engaging environment where improvement is both effective and enjoyable.
5. We will be reviewing and checking with the other members of the Executive, with the hopes that we will have a full slate for the fall AGM.

I have sat in on one Tournament planning meeting and will help out where I can. I will also be helping out at the Rules Seminar at Greenacres.

8 k) Zone Council Representative Report: Pam Kelly

As well as being the chair of our committee, I am also our representative on the BC Zone Council. There are 8 zones across the province and each one has a representative or two on the Council. BC Golf has a new CEO as of last fall – Matthew Steinbach – and he is in the process of implementing several changes and developing a new strategic plan for the organization. It was scheduled to be made public in February but it has not yet been rolled out.

One of the main objectives is to implement a “minimal viable Zone structure framework”. Our Zone is in excellent shape, but some of the less populated Zones are not able to hold tournaments or championships. BC Golf is working towards providing equalization funding and dedicated resources to ensure consistent delivery and representation across the province. The plan is to offer more “hands on” support for the struggling Zones such as managing their Zone Championships, whereas we will continue to manage our own.

Since I do not have the final versions of the Zone Agreement or the Zone Funding Model, I won't try to get into any details. I am sure I will have more to report at the AGM in October.

8 l) Zone Council Report: Pam Kelly

I have now been a member of the executive for almost one year – six months as Vice-Chair and five months as Chair. I want to start by acknowledging and thanking all of the members of our executive. We are all volunteers and it is amazing to see everyone stepping up and putting in many hours to make sure our Zone is being well managed. We had two of our executive members step down since the fall AGM, and I am extremely happy that they both basically found replacements for themselves! We are in a unique situation to have a male representative for our Junior Girls' program, but he has been very involved for several years and I am sure he will do an excellent job. Moira Milligan had to step down as Rules Chair due to returning to work part time, and she brought us Teresa as her replacement. I met with both Moira and Teresa during their handover, and Teresa has already proven to be an amazing asset to our group.

The five months since our AGM have been busy and successful. We had two meetings dedicated to planning and budgeting for the three tournaments we put on each year – jointly with Zone 3. A newsletter was sent out in February announcing that registration for all three tournaments opened on March 1st. You need a pretty low handicap index to play in the Amateur/Senior tournament in May, but both the Two Ball Best Ball and the Fall Classic are open to all women over the age of nineteen. We really encourage all of you to promote the tournaments amongst your own club members as much as possible. Please let them know that you can choose your playing partner or even your entire foursome for either tournament! There are early bird deadlines for all the tournaments so we hope everyone will sign up soon to enjoy the savings.

The Amateur/Senior and Junior Girls tournaments all end up advancing Zone teams to the Provincial level based on excellence in golf and our Women's Committee supports the tournaments and the winning individuals who play in the Provincials. But we also

focus on various activities for recreational golfers as well, including our other two tournaments, interclub team play, our Rules Seminar, and the Business Women's League. BC Golf would really like us to offer tournaments on weekends to open them up to more women, particularly younger women. We need to host the tournaments jointly with Zone 3 in order to get enough registrants to fill shotgun events. It is next to impossible to find a golf course that will allow a shotgun tournament on the weekend. We are tossing around the idea of putting on one or more "Nine 'n' Dine" events that may be able to be held early on a weekend evening. Maybe not this year, but Zone 3 has held several in the past which were very well received.

As mentioned under "Correspondence" – I received an email from one club questioning the process used to schedule the Interclub Team Matches. I organized a Zoom meeting and invited all Team Captains to attend. They had the opportunity to hear from Sherry Work, our webmaster, as she explained the complexities involved in preparing the schedule for three separate groups all playing on the same day.

Throughout the year I was aware of some issues regarding playing Team at Bowen Island. I have had several email and telephone conversations with their Captain, Joanne Gassman. We tossed around several ideas and she will be presenting on these in a few minutes. I have frequently heard that Bowen Island is an excellent course, and they are known for serving wonderful food for lunch. Some of the issues raised were actually inaccurate, so I am sure Joanne's presentation will clarify everything for us.

Serving on the executive results in all of us needing to become familiar with Golf Genius in order to run the tournaments. Several clubs in our Zone use Golf Genius, both for their pro shop staff and also for their own leagues. Since there is growing interest in the web-based program, two women from Tsawwassen Springs will be presenting a "training session" for all of us today.

Lastly, I would like to say how fortunate I am to be working with executive members that have so many strengths to share. Thank you to all of you for all the work you do to ensure the success of our Zone committee while having such busy lives of your own. I am looking forward to the 2026 golf season and I am confident that our members will enjoy your experiences this year.
